

ALL EYES ON US: searching for the famous “Mona Lisa effect” in Cork

You might have heard of the famously eerie “Mona Lisa effect,” an illusion where the eyes of a portrait seem to follow the viewer.

It’s all to do with human perception and how the eyes of a two-dimensional artwork appear to be fixed on the viewer regardless of their position in the room. Or maybe it’s to do with an innate human desire to “feel seen,” rather than a physical effect.

Crawford Art Gallery’s winter portrait exhibition, ALL EYES ON US, invites the public to investigate for themselves. Just like Leonardo da Vinci’s *Mona Lisa*, will the eyes of the portraits follow you around the room, to unsettling effect? Are you the watcher, or are you being watched?

ALL EYES ON US is a salon-style presentation of Crawford Art Gallery’s portrait collection in which we, the viewer, are scrutinized by the eyes in dozens of portraits. What happens when we return their gaze?

The exhibition combines much-loved favourites, such as Victoria Russell’s beguiling portrait of Fiona Shaw and Murdo Mcleod’s eye-catching portrait of Roy Keane, with lesser-known works like Gerald Festus Kelly’s portrait of fascinating Russian author and translator Sasha Kropotkin and Kevin Mooney’s *Storyteller*, a surprising portrait of Peig Sayers.

ALL EYES ON US invites viewers to gaze deep into the souls of figures familiar and forgotten and invites us to explore who gets to look at whom and prompting questions of power and performance in the process.

Institiúid chultúrtha náisiúnta Éireannach is ea Gailearaí Ealaíne Crawford, atá tiomanta d'amharc-ealaín chomhaimseartha agus stairiúil, atá lonnaithe i bhfoirgneamh oidhreachta suntasach i gcroílár chathair Chorcaí. Cuireann sé clár bríomhar dinimiciúil de thaispeántais shealadacha ar fáil, agus tá bailiúchán ann freisin a bhfuil tábhacht náisiúnta aige agus a insíonn scéal iontach faoi Chorcaigh agus faoi Éirinn le trí chéad bliain anuas.

Tógadh an Gailearaí den chéad uair i 1724 mar Theach Custaim na cathrach, áit a bhfuil na Cásálacha cáiliúla Canova, a bronnadh ar Chorcaigh dhá chéad bliain ó shin. Tá ealaíontóirí comhaimseartha Aideen Barry, Gerard Byrne, Maud Cotter, Dorothy Cross, Tacita Dean, agus Sean Scully le feiceáil i mbailiúchán an ghailearaí, chomh maith le saothair leis na

healaíontóirí Éireannacha James Barry, Harry Clarke, Mainie Jellett, Seán Keating, Daniel Maclise, Norah McGuinness, Edith Somerville, agus Jack B. Yeats.
