A Tour Guide can bring you around and show you the artwork.



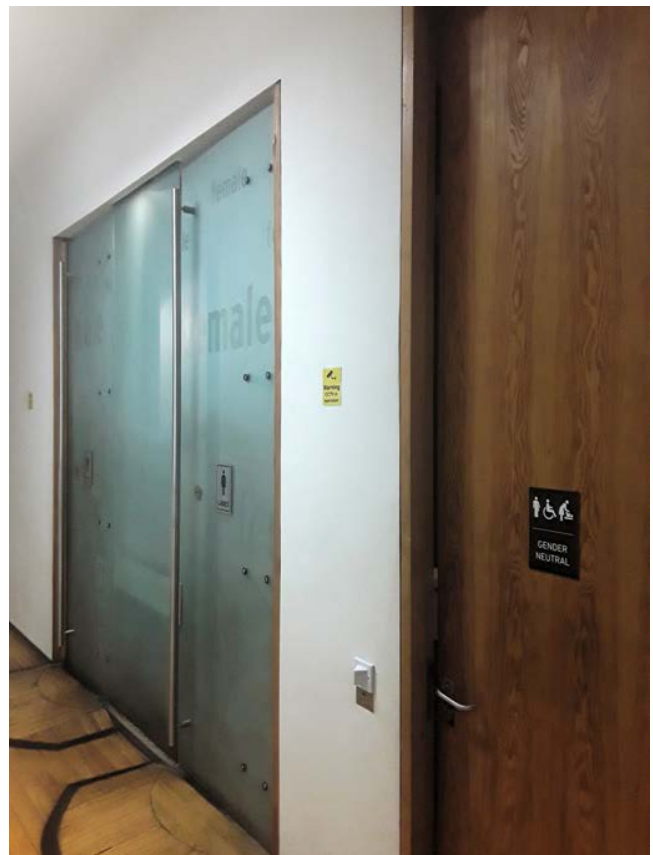
Don't be afraid to ask questions!

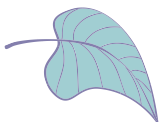


# Explore!

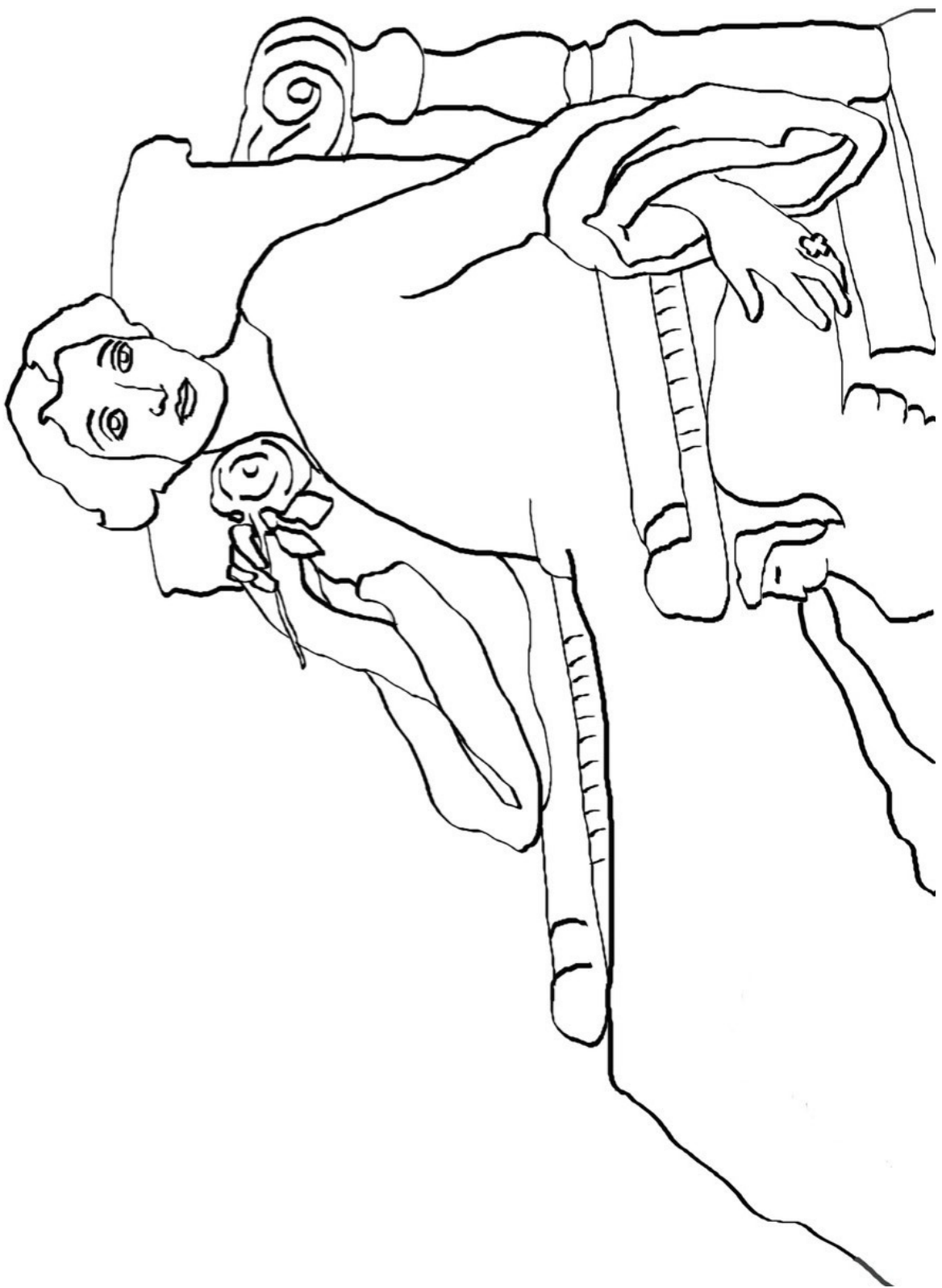
