This gallery is home to over 3,000 works of art and the building has been here for over 300 years...

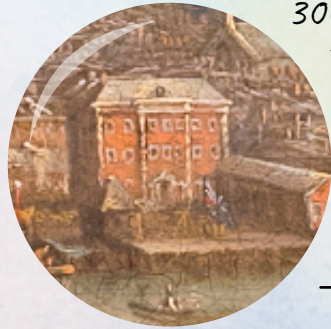
Make sure to pick up some colouring pencils from our Bookshop and fill in all the pages of this activity book.

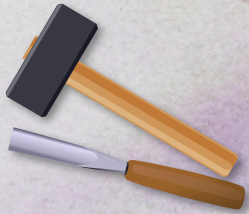

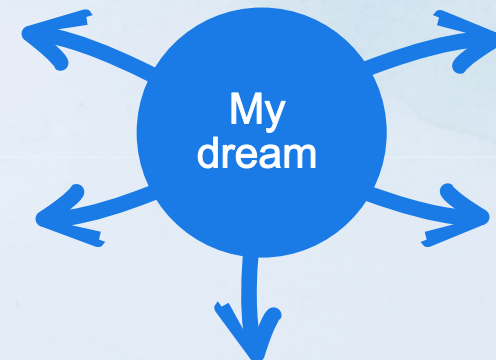
