The Zurich Portrait Prize and Zurich Young Portrait Prize return to Crawford Art Gallery

Crawford Art Gallery is delighted to once again welcome the Zurich Portrait Prize to Cork and Munster, in partnership with the National Gallery of Ireland. Sponsored by Zurich Insurance plc, this is the third time the exhibition will travel outside of Dublin to Crawford Art Gallery, creating a wider opportunity for the public to encounter the remarkable portraits on display. The exhibition features the twenty-four shortlisted works from the 2021 edition as chosen by an esteemed judging panel.

Also making a welcome return is the Zurich Young Portrait Prize, a special competition for young people which encourages them to shape who we see and how we see them. The twenty shortlisted works from 2021, created by

young artists aged between 5 and 18, will be on display together with the Zurich Portrait Prize at Crawford Art Gallery from 23 April until 17 July 2022. Mary McCarthy, Director of Crawford says 'Both exhibitions will be displayed together in the historic Gibson Galleries at the heart of Crawford, offering the perfect opportunity for visitors to experience the work by this year's winning, highly commended, and shortlisted artists. A companion catalogue will be available from the gallery shop. This partnership with the National Gallery of Ireland is important to Crawford and ensures that together we broaden access to this important initiative. It means we open after our temporary closure with exciting new perspectives for our audiences'.

Responding to significant ideas of identity and experience, the 24 works shortlisted for the Zurich Portrait Prize 2021 once again demonstrate the exceptional breadth that exists in contemporary Irish portraiture. Employing oils, acrylic, pastel, egg tempera, video, photography, even hair and dust, the selected artworks make for an exciting, sometimes unexpected art encounter for visitors. The shortlisted portraits were chosen by the 2021 judging panel, comprising artist Eamonn Doyle, Róisín Kennedy (University College Dublin), and curator Sean Kissane (Irish Museum of Modern Art).

The winning artist, Salvatore of Lucan, received a cash prize of \leq 15,000, and a commission worth \leq 5,000 to create a work for inclusion in the National Portrait Collection at the National Gallery of Ireland. Two highly commended artists, Vanessa Jones and Tom McLean, also received \leq 1,500 each.

Now in its third year, the Zurich **Young** Portrait Prize is a special competition focused on young artists in Ireland. It is an inclusive art competition open to children and young people of all abilities, aged up to 18, from across the island of Ireland. The difficult task of shortlisting works for Zurich **Young** Portrait Prize 2021 fell to visual artists Aideen Barry and Joe

Caslin, and curator Tadhg Crowley (The Glucksman). The exhibition showcases works by artists from the ages of 5 to 18 across four separate categories. Add winning artists?

Zurich Portrait Prize 2021 and Zurich **Young** Portrait Prize 2021 can be visited daily at Crawford Art Gallery from 23 April until 17 July 2022, with an array of online offerings on the gallery website. Entry to the gallery and exhibitions is free.

The Portrait Prize, open to artists aged 19 over, ran for the eighth time in 2021 with Zurich as sponsor for the fourth year. The aim of the Zurich Portrait Prize is to showcase and encourage interest in contemporary portraiture, support Irish talent and to raise the profile of the long-standing and constantly evolving National Portrait Collection at the National Gallery of Ireland. The shortlisted artists' works were exhibited in the National Gallery of Ireland from in late 2021 and early 2022, and will be on display at Crawford Art Gallery from 23 April - 17 July 2022.
